
UIRR - Overview



- Members: Combined Transport Operators and Terminal Managers, who enable the efficient insertion of rail into transport-chains
- Logistics companies, road hauliers: customers as well as shareholders of UIRR Members

Performance: UIRR Members handled about 50% of European Combined
 Transport in 2014

- Interest: fair regulatory conditions in transport to enable competition on the basis of technical merit and competence/management excellence
- UIRR: founded in 1970- seat in Brussels since 1988

UIRR for terminals



- Promote: homogeneous European regulatory framework
 - Implementing Act on Access to Essential Facilities under Directive 2012/34
 - Corridor Regulation (913/2010) upcoming revision
 - Combined Transport Directive (92/106) upcoming revision







- **Enhance**: efficiency gains through improved operations
 - EU Projects: EcoHubs, DESTINY, IMCOSEC, Agora, Last mile Study, etc.
 - Terminal Interest Group: UIRR Best Practice Recommendations e.g. UIRR General Terms and Conditions, load planning, entry/exit procedures, last mile road optimisation, security
 - Standardisation: CEN, UIC, ERA, RNE, ISO
- Support: daily operations with services
 - ILU-Code: identification of loading units OCR optimisation
 - IT systems: UIRR datamessage/terminal codes, TiS for Terminals
 - Last Mile Portal: railfreightlocations.eu






The UIRR terminal vision
